The School received a lovely certificate and letter from Air Marshal Sir John Kemball, for the positive contribution that Kuk Sool Won is making to our County.

Black Belt Club (BBC)

In line with our goals for 2008 we launched our Black Belt Club in February.

10 DBN's and black belts pitched up for our first training session at Woodhall on a chilly Saturday morning and were rewarded with some real one-to-one tuition time with the KSNs. A key privilege of attendance is that

students get to cover, indepth, areas that we often have to do quickly in class and so everyone was chuffed when we progressed through bong spinning and onto bong form. We also upped the stakes on the fitness front rapidly running through all the under black belt forms each in four directions with

On that basis, Kuk Sa Nim believes students ought to opt out of regular competition only under exceptional circumstances rather than opt in if they feel like it.

The venue is < 1 hour drive from Sudbury so petrol costs are low and there are no hotel bills involved. With nearly 5 months notice, there is no excuse for any adult, youth, child or Little Dragon for not entering this tournament.

So; put the date in your diary, start saving your pennies for the entry fee and get practicing so you can win loads of medals and perhaps become a European Champion!!!
